Course Description:

Understanding the Federal and State laws for providing special education programs in our public schools is imperative to ensure the compliant delivery of services to qualified students. This course provides an overview of the rules and regulations required for providing special education services. Based on WAC 392-172A and specific court cases, instruction provides participants with the tools needed to provide compliant services.

Key legislation that drives special education in Washington Free appropriate public education Evaluation Individualized education program Least restrictive environment Parent and student participation in decisions Procedural due process

Building upon the foundation of the Special Education Law (6hr) course, attendees will be able to demonstrate their knowledge of empowerment by using mandated rules and regulations to advocate for special education program, staff and students. Participants will learn how to build local association capacity to solve issues for special education staff through strategies such as protecting rights under contract language and using the Union Shield to ensure fair and appropriate special education service delivery. Participant teams will identify and design action plans to address the 2 to 3 most pressing special education issues within their district/region.
